I can not thank the fellowship enough for the opportunity to share in the experience, strength and hope of over 800 members of AA from the North East Region, all in service. We had "signer's" for the deaf as well as interpreters for the Spanish speaking members. With the Grace of my Higher Power I hope to show my gratitude by sharing what I learned and will forever continue to learn.

We had six panels with the opportunity for comments and discussion on the hot topics around the fellowship today. The topics ranged from: How to protect anonymity in the ever growing digital age. Is social media helping or hindering our primary purpose? Are online meetings really anonymous? Transforming AA's membership survey to digital format and how this affects our non-digital communities?

Membership awareness in regards to how our lack of diversity affects our membership? Concern for safety in the rooms, ie., physically, sexually, and discrimination in our diverse world today

Do our actions before, after and during a meeting show true genuine tolerance, acceptance and love for one another to help the still suffering alcoholic gain sobriety? Is our primary purpose still relevant today?

Is there a need for literature on transgender and gender non-conforming Alcoholics; literature for safety in the rooms; a book and/or addition to the 12&12 to include the 12 concepts, being the 12&12&12?

Price increase for literature, sales of literature to outside sources, the 75th Anniversary printing of the Big Book and how all that effects the bottom line ... \$\$\$. How the contributions from the basket serve many purposes set by the home group, the "Birthday Envelope" is sent directly to the GSO to serve "OUR" primary purpose.

21 Roundtable sessions over 2 nights, unfortunately you can only attend one a day, due to them all being scheduled at the same time. These sessions were basically discussion groups on service related positions (DCM/alt, archives, special needs, PI/CPC, newsletter, inter-groups, corrections, secretary, chairperson etc, etc..). In my effort to gain and bring back as much information as possible I attended two sessions, the DCM/alternate and Cooperation with the professional community.

The DCM/alt discussion was on how to reach out to more home groups and GSR's. A visitation committee was suggested to reach out to our less illuminated (dark) groups. Workshops and/or discussion meetings to get more fellowship and their sponsor's involved in service. Sponsor's lead by example.

The CPC discussion revolved around inventive ways to reach the still suffering alcoholic. Ways to approach business's and the different type's of business's to approach. So much sharing of idea's that have worked in other Area's, and how they can work for us. All of which require time and service from the fellowship, "WE" have the responsibility to carry "OUR" message to the still suffering Alcoholic just as it was carried to "US". 
H & I REPORT

Concept II

Studying Concept II in March is serendipitous considering that the General Service Conference will be taking place in April in New York City and we actually get the opportunity to watch this Concept in action in our home groups, our district, and our area.

The purpose of Concept II outlines the why and how of Bill W. and Dr. Bob's plan to turn the running of AA over to us! However, the dilemma is how do the AA's in Central Westmoreland County have the time to run a World Service Office in New York, publish books, carry out our international public relations, put out the Grapevine every month, and attend to the myriad of phone calls, email and correspondence that arrive and GSO every day?

The answer to that question is, that we don't have the time, but our founders also didn't want us to run into the problems that have beset many other organizations from time out of mind, so, in order to keep those who do run our organization for us "from perilous wealth and power" AA is structured in what would be considered an upside down manner by most businesses, but for us, it works! I challenge you all to check the <u>Service Manual</u>, or look online for the AA Conference Structure, which is an inverted pyramid, with the AA Groups on top. That diagram shows exactly how our individual group conscience messages are carried to GSO.

This means that even though we can't oversee the day-to-day operations in New York, we have a delegate, who is a trusted servant, that will carry our home group instructions to the General Service Office every year, and who will report back to us, all the actions that happen at that Conference and how it impacts us.

In Area 60, we are fortunate to have our Get-Away Weekend, coming up the last weekend of March, where we will discuss many important items that are happening at GSO and how we think these issues should be handled. We also have the honor of hosting one of our employees from GSO for the weekend to answer questions that we have, and who will also give their lead at the Saturday evening banquet.

You do not have to be active in service to come to the Get-Away Weekend and learn about "your AA," and see Concept II in action, everyone is welcome. I hope to see many of you there as we keep "trudging the road of happy destiny."
