## **Committee Reports**

### DCM Report

Hello District 23,

There's much to report and as I usually do, I will open with a message. "If you want to be heard, send someone. If you want to know what's going on, send someone. The key words here are "Send" and "Someone."

Of the reporting districts, we were once again the best represented. We had at voting time, besides myself, our alt. DCM, 7 GSR's, 2 alt. GSR's and two AA members. For a grand total of 13 people from our district. I felt our numbers were the best represented of all the districts, yet know we can be better. I'm content with how we were represented.

On the panel of Growth, your DCM gave a 4-page speech on "Diversity in AA". Let me say this was the elephant in the room speech. As I spoke on this topic mostly everyone's eyes were as big as silver dollars, especially at the end during the question and answer session. I was saddened to learn, yet not surprised, even in dominantly African American communities that the number of them actively attending meetings is, few to none. We have a lot of work to do here, on the grounds of diversity in general.

In the presentation, Finance: The 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition, a common occurring number kept sticking out for me, \$7.14. In other words, that's the average cost per member GSO spends per year in AA. Remember, when we all were active alcoholics we spent more than this to feed our alcoholism in a year. We spend more than \$7.14 in a week buying lattes before a meeting we attend. So, beginning with me, my monthly contribution to GSO will be \$10.00 per month. It's the least I can do for a program that's saving my life daily. Please consider that.

While at the getaway weekend, I really liked the round table discussions that we had. The DCMs round table was very interesting as we all shared ideas on how to problem solve, help keep our districts from running into tradition problems, helping that of all our meetings with any problem they may have. We discussed helping the GSR's present more information to their home groups other than just reporting about when their next meeting will be. As a DCM of a large district, sI reached out for help and received plenty of good suggestion from everyone.

Here's how the voting went at the getaway weekend: Policy and Admission: Item J "Consider a request to add a "YPAA subcommittee to the service structure.' Vote was for more consideration.

Item H "Consider a request to allow regional service committees to bid to host the general service conference." Vote was for more consideration.

Item G "Consider a request that the General Service Conference be held in New York City every other year." No action taken.

Item D "Consider request that anonymity-protected digital final conference be published, starting with the 67

General Service Conference. Vote was for additional consideration to make both copies on anonymity.

Public Information: All items were no action to be taken, for all items are just to be reviewed. For there was nothing to be voted on.

Literature: Item A "Consider request for revisions to the pamphlet "questions and Answers on Sponsorship" Vote was For No Action to Be Taken.

Item B "consider request to retire the pamphlet Too Young." The vote was retiring Too Young.

Item J "consider request for literature and/or language. The vote was to take no action.

Item K "Discuss request for a revision to the pamphlet, "The A.A. Group." The vote was to take no action.

I also found out that use of the spirit of rotation is in place for a reason. This so that no one person can have any influence or derive any power from it as I have come to understand it in layman's terms. So, if there is a position that is left open due to a person stepping down in the spirit of rotation, we as a district should pick up that position until a qualified person is found. For instance, we have two people who have severed their positions well. Is it fair to hold anyone back from other service work that can be done elsewhere in A.A.?
